IFMAMembership Recognition

Loren Steel, CFM

Corporate Facilities Manager Matsushita Avionics Systems Corporation

Loren has been an active member of IFMA since 1989. Three years ago he relocated to the Seattle area from the Midwest where he acquired several years of facility management experience with public sector, construction, architecture and insurance industry employers. He works for Matsushita Avionics Systems Corporation (MAS) in Bothell. MAS is the world leader in in-flight entertainment systems with facilities located around the world.



Loren finds it interesting and meaningful to understand how people work, how they prefer to work and how well the building design and operation responds to its occupants' needs. "Addressing the various facility management roles in my work history has provided me with an appreciation for people and processes and where they work. Even with sophisticated,

mature organizations, it seems that success depends on how well people communicate with one another to understand expectations, establish priorities and then deliver on them," he said.

His interest in facility management grew from an architecture and design education where an emphasis on environmental behavior and special populations uncovered the long-term impact of short-term design processes. Loren's opinion that the best designers approach their work by cultivating relationships with a variety of process

stakeholders like users, service providers, sponsors and the people that maintain the building; made it easy for him to focus his attention on facility management as a career field. "After discovering IFMA, things just seemed to click into place for me."

Earning his Certified Facility Manager designation seemed to be a good companion accomplishment along with his architectural registration. However, both of those achievements mean less to Loren than good relationships with savvy facility managers who are enthusiastic about their work.



For Loren, the two most meaningful things about IFMA membership are the variety of people and job types of the members and the fact that very few professional members compete with one another. He explained, "People gravitate to facility management from a variety of other career fields. It is not unusual to participate in an interesting discussion with a business executive involved with facility management and an equally important maintenance manager, both of whom are IFMA members. And in contrast to many industry or career associations, most professional IFMA members' employers do not compete with one another, which makes it easier for them to talk about their work. I can pick up the phone right now, ask for insight and advice from an IFMA professional and not be concerned about our competing interests. Can you imagine other professionals, like accountants, designers or attorneys easily seeking advice from their peers at another firm? For most professional IFMA members there are no trade secrets about how we get things done. Our camaraderie can be an important asset for us."
