LEED CI and Sustainability Workshop

The Green Resource Council of the Northwest (GRC-NW) is hosting its second LEED CI and Sustainability Workshop on Thursday, November 15, 2007 from 8:30 – 1:30 at UW's Center for Urban Horticulture, Northwest Horticultural Society (NHS) Hall.

The event will include a 2-hour morning training session – "Specifying Green- Pulling it All Together" Certification Systems – First, Second and Third Party – followed by an afternoon Green Roundtable on "specifying green" for commercial interiors. Gene Lisa, 2007 NeoCon speaker, will host the morning session. Guest panelists for the afternoon roundtable include Colleen Hazelrigs, Hazelrigs Architecture & Design; Sandy Campbell, IIDA, One Earth One Design; Bill Gregory, Director of Sustainable Strategies, Milliken Carpet; Scot Davidson, Ecoworks; and Eli Gilbert, CAF.

The half-day event is tailored specifically for professionals in the commercial interiors industry and is certified by IIDA for CEU credits. The cost is \$95 per person (includes both sessions and lunch).

The education committee provides information and advice to members seeking professional development, technical training, and credentialing to enhance their career growth. We organize a one-day annual symposium in March.


Very Efficient HVAC Systems May Qualify for Tax Deductions

The Energy Policy Act of 2005 (EPAct) provides potentially significant tax deductions for energy efficient HVAC systems installed in new and existing buildings. But there is a caveat: To qualify for the deduction, the HVAC system must reduce energy costs by at least 16.67 percent compared to HVAC systems designed to meet ASHRAE 90.1-2001.

Under current law, the project must be placed in service between Jan. 1, 2006 and Dec. 31, 2008 to qualify for EPAct tax benefits. There are efforts in Congress to increase the tax deductions and extend EPAct through the 2012 tax year and through 2014 for projects certified as of 2012.



What is the IFMA Foundation all about? By Peter Renner, CFM IFMA Seattle Vice President

From time to time, the IFMA Foundation is mentioned in this newsletter. Twice this year, for example, our chapter made \$1,000 contributions to the Foundation. What happens to that money? Who runs the Foundation? What's its purpose?

Started in 1990, the IFMA Foundation is a 501 (c) (3) organization that promotes priority research and educational opportunities for the advancement of the facility management profession. The Foundation Board of Trustees tends toward former IFMA national office holders. Foundation workers, those volunteers who organize and run Foundation events at World Workplace, for example, are just regular chapter officers from many different chapters.

The prime fundraisers are both held in conjunction with World Workplace, which this year was back in New Orleans. The Doug Underwood Golf Tournament is a fixture at WW. I've attended most of these over the last 15 years or so. The quality has continuously improved, markedly in the last 6 years. I've had playing partners from Germany, Japan, Canada, and 20 states that I can remember. As a golf tournament it's very good, and as a fund raiser, it's very successful.

The other fundraiser at WW is the Foundation Gala. This is basically a big party with a geographic theme. In Chicago, the Gala was held at the House of Blues. In New Orleans the last time, at Preservation Hall with music by ... the Preservation Hall Jazz Band. The gala is networking at its best, and again, a well-attended, fun, and successful raiser of funds.

At the other end of the money tube, the Foundation provides scholarships for facility management students in accredited programs. I make a point of chatting with the scholarship recipients every year, and I'm continually impressed with their seriousness and dedication to the profession.

The Foundation also provides scholarships for chapter members to participate in IFMA training, including attendance at World Workplace, when chapter members are not supported by their employers, perish the thought.

And finally, the Foundation supports facility management research, for which it often receives corporate grants. Research products include manuals related to pandemic preparedness, green building techniques, terrorism prevention and response, accessibility, violence in the workplace, and my personal favorite, Salary Profiles of Facility Management Professionals.

Like many aspects of your IFMA membership, participation in IFMA Foundation activities yields benefits in direct proportion to involvement.
